Operational Guidelines

- 1. Choose your own level of involvement / participation.
- 2. Use "I" statements, speak only for yourself.
- 3. Remind (with questions) that we have operating agreements.
- 4. Ask for permission to continue a conversation.
- 5. Ask for, and honor, confidentiality.
- 6. Seek balance between inquiry and advocacy.
- 7. Use check-in. Don't hold the group hostage to one issue, Use "Parking Lot."
- 8. Speak from the heart. Presume innocence. Assume positive intentions of others.
- 9. Mind commitments, now, and for the future.
- 10. Practice mutual respect. Recognize that we can disagree while still being supportive of one another.
- 11. Listen with the intent of understanding.
- 12. NC speaks with "one voice," and all staff must support these decisions, even if not in agreement.
