Operational Guidelines

1. Choose your own level of involvement / participation.
2. Use "I" statements, speak only for yourself.
3. Remind (with questions) that we have operating agreements.
4. Ask for permission to continue a conversation.
5. Ask for, and honor, confidentiality.
6. Seek balance between inquiry and advocacy.
7. Use check-in. Don't hold the group hostage to one issue, Use "Parking Lot."
8. Speak from the heart. Presume innocence. Assume positive intentions of others.
9. Mind commitments, now, and for the future.
10. Practice mutual respect. Recognize that we can disagree while still being supportive of one another.
11. Listen with the intent of understanding.
12. NC speaks with "one voice," and all staff must support these decisions, even if not in agreement.
